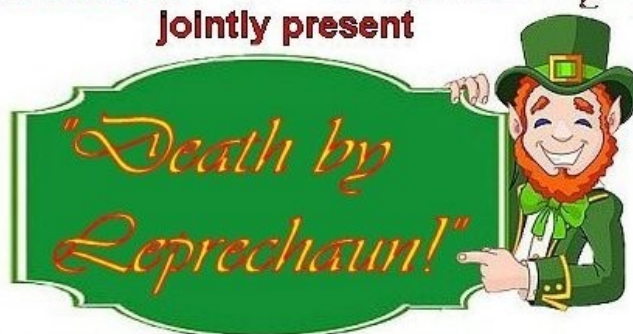




**SEVERN VALLEY RAILWAY** & *Murder by Appointment*
