REQUEST STOPS

If you wish to get off the train at Northwood or Country Park Halt, please inform the guard before joining the train. To join the train at Northwood or Country Park Halt, signal to the train with a horizontal arm extended in the air. Trains will only stop during daylight hours.

SAFETY ON THE SEVERN VALLEY RAILWAY

Please take a moment to read the following safety advice:

! The heritage environment - please be aware sudden loud noises, whistles, horns, escaping steam and locomotive fumes are to be expected.

! Do not lean out of any windows and doors - please keep your head, arms and all body parts inside the train at all times when its moving. There is a risk of you colliding with an object such as overhanging branches, lineside structures or even another train which could result in serious injury or worse.



! Any visitors acting in an unsafe manner either to themselves or to others may be required to leave the railway in accordance with our published Conditions of Carriage.

! Carriage doors

- Our carriage doors are not automatically controlled like on modern trains.
- Our doors require manual operation to open and close effectively, if in doubt seek staff assistance.
- Only attempt to open the doors when the train is completely stationary and you have checked you are at a station.



! Platforms and trains

- Before opening a door, always check that the train is at a station.
- Be aware of the gap between the train and the platform at each station.
- **DO NOT** alight on platform ramps – these are the sloped sections at the end of platforms.
- Carriage doors are not to be opened over a platform ramp, the door being used must be over a level part of the platform.



! Barrow crossings - always use a bridge if available

These are pedestrian walkways which cross the railway tracks.

- Be aware: look left, look right.
- Never cross when a train is approaching.
